Ushaben, your academic career has been illustrious both in India and abroad. We are proud you have been associated with SNDT University in several capacities. All along you have played an encouraging role and enthused us to further progress. You are a Gandhian, a feminist, a freedom fighter, a reformer, an academician, an adminstrator, a writer, a researcher and a teacher all rolled in one.

The various awards you have won over the years reflect your multifaceted talent. The pursuit and promotion of knowledge and education by an individual or an institution is in itself commendable. When women are the beneficiaries of such an enterprise and initiative, it becomes a truly laudable activity and has more far reaching consequences for the achievements of a nation. The work done by the Marwadi Sammelan is therefore truly noble and worthy of appreciation.

When the S. N. D. T. University for Women closed the Hindi Medium Section of its Degree Classes, many Girl Students who wanted to pursue higher studies through Hindi found it difficult to continue their studies after Matriculation. The Marwadi Sammelan, the pioneer in spreading and popularising Hindi, came forward and established Mahila Mahavidyalaya in the year 1958, with a handful of Students in Pre-University and T.Y. B.A. classes. In recognition of the sincerity, dedication and preservance of the Marwadi Sammelan, S. N. D. T. Women's University granted affiliation to the College in 1960. Around that time, the Smt. Bhagirathibai Manmal Ruia Trust donated Rs. 15,000/- to help the Management to expand the College. In honour of Smt. Bhagirathibhai Manmal Ruia, the Mahila College was renamed Smt. Bhagirathibai Manmal Ruia Mahila Mahavidyalaya, in the year 1963. Meanwhile, as the number of students started increasing, the Managment decided to shift the College from Sitaram Poddar Bhavan, Phanas Wadi, to its present address, at 11, Krishna Kunj, Wachha Gandi Road, Gamdevi, Bombay 400 007, in 1968. Steady addition to the number of students created acute shortage of rooms, to solve the problem, three more floors were raised above the exist-

The College conducts both Degree and Junior Classes of Arts and Commerce. Arts students are taught through Hindi Medium and Commerce through English Medium. Owing to the demands

of many parents, the College has opened English medium sections of Junior College Arts in 1996. In June 1979, Smt. B. M. Ruia Mahila Mahavidyah, was granted permanent affiliation by the S. N. D. T. University. Since 1989, Computer Application as a subject has been introduced for Commerce students. Besides the Commerce students, girls of other streams are also given training in Computers through short term courses. When, in 1981, the College opened Post-Graudation Studies in Economics and Hindi, many of our aspiring students who could not think of doing Post-Graduation because of language problem found their dream had come true.

Along with regular studies, students are encouraged to take part in different co-curricular and en tra-curricular activities as a means of developing their personalities as well as to show the hidden talents in them. Every year the students Council of B. M. Ruia Girls College organizes Inter-Colle giate Debate Competition, Elocution, Essay writing, Self-Composed Poetry Recitation, Talentshows, besides Mehandi, Poster-Painting, Rangoli Cartoon drawing, Greeting Cards making and Quiz. At the College level, the Students Council orgainses Literacy Day, Teachers Day, Sadbhavana Day, etc. and on the occasion of Hindi Divas, an Inter-Collegiate Debate Competition is organised by B. M. Ruia Girls. From time to time, seminars and workshops are organised by different departments like the N. S. S. and the Population Education Section. Renowned academicians, professionals and experts are invited to enlighten the students through their lectures and informative observations. To make girls aware of the menace of AIDS and Population Explosion, the N. S. S. Unit and Population Education invites Doctors and So-

cial Workers to hold work-shops on such issues.
To make the students aware of our Cultural heritage, S. N. D. T. University organises an Annual Youth Festival and every year our students take



active part in almost all the events. B. M. Ruia has a good record of producing students who secure high ranks and distinctions in various examinations of the S. N. D. T. University.

Marwadi Sammelan, is always ready to promote the cause of Women's Education. With a view to encourage intelligent students, the Sammelan has instituted many scholoarships and needy students

are given financial help.

The Smt. Kishoridevi Bhadwandas Lohia Library is the pride of our College. At present, there are 1500 books on different subjects like Literature, History, Economics, Sociology, Commerce, Accountancy, Computer Science, Religion, Art and Culture, Philosophy & Psychology and many others. There is a seperate section for books on Law an Legal matters in the Library. Justice D. R. Dhanuka, has donated Rs. 50,000/- to the Library to open this section which is dedicated to the memory of his father, late Shri Ramlal Dhanuka, on 5th October, 1997. Members of the Marwadi Sammelan enrich the Library from time to time by donating books to the Library. Besides books, the Library subscribes to various magazines, journals and Dailies to keep students abreast with current affairs.

In 1989 - 90, the Marwadi Sammelan instituted the Sahitya Puraskar to honour littrateur in the Hindi, Marathi, Rajasthani and Gujarati languages. Since 1991, this Literary Award has been named as the "Shri Ghanshyamdas Saraf Sahitya Puraskar." The award is overseen and conducted by the Marwadi Sammelan. The Award was conceived by the Principal, Dr. (Mrs.) Suman Jain.

In September, 1993, in memory of Late Shri Ramprasadji Poddar, the College Hall was named, "Shri Ramprasad Poddar." In September, 1995, in memory of Shri late Shri Ramprasadji Poddar, an Annual Inter-Collegiate Bhajan Competition is organised by the College. Marwadi Sammelan instituted a shield to be given to the best performer. The Sammelan also has been organising an Annual Bhajan Sandhya to felicitate the Prize Winners. Renowed singers like Shri Purshottamji

Jalota, Shri Anup Jalota, Harendra Khurana, Smt. Manju Bhatia enthralled the audience with their divine songs on such occasions.

In September 1997, the Marine Lines Junior Chamber of Commerce awarded the "Out standing Women of the City Award" to our Principal, Dr. (Mrs.) Suman Jain. She was selected for her dedicated services in the field of education.

On 5th October 1997, in a brief but befitting ceremony, in the presence of Hon'ble State Minister, Shri Raj Purohit, Smt. Jayawantiben Mehta, (MP), and Shri Murli Deora (Ex-MP), the junction between Hughes Road and Wachha Gandhi Road was named "Manad Major Ramprasad Poddar Chowk." On the same day, two small boards were installed at both ends of Wachha Gandhi Road.

The sapling, Mahila Mahavidyalya planted 40 years before by the Marwadi Sammelan has grown into a huge tree of knowledge and wisdom spreading its branches in all the directions and offering refuge to all those who came in search of knowledge of enlightment. At present 1150 students are studying in different classes and the Mahavidyalya is well known as the only Hindi-Medium College.





Hiraben Nanavati Institute of Home Science and Smt. Kalavatiben Boda Instrute of Commerce were established.



In addition to the regular library, Palanpurnivasi Late Smt. Maniben R. Mehta College Book Bank and various schemes such as Nibhav Fund, College Accessories Bank, Boda Nasta Fund, Living Expenses Fund and Publication Fund were started in order to help the students from K.G. to Under Graduate level.

The Present Principal Smt. Kumudhavalli had the good fortune to supervise the activities of the Home Science section as its Vice-Principal from 1987 to 1995. This, in a way proved to be a grooming exercise for her. It prepared her to take up the responsibility as the Principal of the Colleges and Institutes after the retirement of Principal Smt. Pranaybala Koticha.


